This automated door will assist those with a disability, it is especially designed for wheelchair access. The wooden door on the inside is still in place, if weather conditions allow please leave this open. If the door is closed and you see a parishioner requiring assistance, please do help and open the door for them.
- The Parish Office and Our Lady's Hall reopened on the 6<sup>th</sup> July.
