The Legion of Mary is celebrating 100 years during 2021 – 2022

Frank Duff was "a man ahead of his time", the Archbishop of Dublin said September 3, as he celebrated Mass to mark 100 years since the Legion of Mary was founded. In Archbishop Dermot Farrell homily in the church of St Nicholas of Myra on Francis Street, across the road from Myra house where the Legion's first meeting took place September 7, 1921, Dr Dermot Farrell described Mr Duff "as prophetic in the true Christian sense of that word".

"A man ahead of this time", Frank Duff was "someone sensitive to the call of God and utterly dedicated to God's will", the archbishop told the 50 people attending the Mass, including Mary Murphy, president of the Legion of Mary.
