Legion of Mary - Centenary Celebrations On Sunday 1st May at 5:30pm Mass. The Mass will be offered in Thanksgiving for the Legion of Mary, for the prayers and efforts of legionaries all over the world. The Legion of Mary in Fairview – Our Lady of the Universe meet every Tuesday at 10:45am in the meeting room. The object of the Legion of Mary is the glory of God through the holiness of its members developed by prayer and active co-operation in Mary's and the Church's work. The unit of the Legion of Mary is called a praesidium, which holds a weekly meeting, where prayer is interminaled with reports and discussion. Persons who wish to join the Legion must apply for membership in a Praesidium - in Fairview - Our Lady of the Universe. The Legion sees as its priority the spiritual and social welfare of each individual. The members participate in the life of the parish through visitation of families, the sick, both in their homes and in hospitals and through collaboration in every apostolic and missionary undertaking sponsored by the parish. Every legionary is required to carry out a weekly apostolic work in the spirit of faith and in union with Mary. Founder of the Legion of Mary, Frank Duff was born in Dublin, Ireland, on June 7, 1889. He entered the Civil Service at the age of 18. At 24 he joined the Society of St. Vincent de Paul where he was led to a deeper commitment to his Catholic faith and at the same time he acquired a great sensitivity to the needs of the poor and underprivileged.

Along with a group of Catholic women and Fr. Michael Toher, Dublin Archdiocese, he formed the first praesidium of the Legion of Mary on September 7, 1921.

Pope: Transform mindsets of war into plans for peace

Pope Francis has again seized the opportunity to call on humanity to change its mindset and to plan for peace. Addressing participants in a Catholic National Congress on Hispanic Ministry, he notes that we are living an "absurd time in which, without having yet come out of a pandemic that has afflicted all humanity with great suffering and sorrow, we find ourselves in the midst of the suffering and tragedy of a war." "Every war is born of injustice, every war, including those that at times we wage in our families and communities, which are fought in silence; they too are born of injustice."

Among the many dimensions of the way the Church is being transformed are not only the change in Western society and culture but also in the attention being paid to where God is leading people of faith. The Spirit of God is always at work among us: just as the Spirit was present in Jesus on the Cross, so the Spirit is among the People of God in these difficult times. Together with priests, lay ministers are enabling a new way of being the Church that is building hope and a new future for the people of the Archdiocese. I ask you to be generous in your giving to the Lay Ministry Collection this Sunday, aware that the pastoral needs of the diocese have changed and grown, as has the need for all kinds of lay ministries.
