A Celebration of thanksgiving for the charitable work of the Religious Sisters of Charity. The Sisters of Charity founded St. Vincent's Hospital on its original St. Stephen's Green site in 1835. It was run by women, for women. The congregation was established in 1815 by Venerable Mother Mary Aikenhead and it played a leading role in the fight against a terrible cholera outbreak in Dublin 1832. A Group of laypeople asked the nuns to take over the running of Temple street hospital in 1876. Three years later they setup the countries first hospice for the dying, Our Lady's in Harold's Cross, Dublin. Hospitals in many counties in Ireland and all around the world, healthcare systems have been built on religious foundations. To this day the Order are involved in prison ministry, education, assisting the homeless, helping immigrants, offering mental health support and fighting sex trafficking. All this is overlooked because they also ran Magdalene laundries.
