### **“Evangelium Vitae” / “The Gospel of Life”**

Following the Rally for life - to **save babies in the mother's womb**, which took  
place yesterday 2nd July. Let us reflect on “Evangelium Vitae,” meaning “The  
Gospel of Life,”. This was written on 25 March 1995 by Saint John Paul II. To re-  
affirm the value and inviolability of every human life to appeal to all people to  
respect, protect, love and serve every human life.

Saint John Paul II saw the change in European society leading up to WW II and  
the acceptance in Nazi society before the war started of a child euthanasia  
programme by families, politicians, medical personnel and gave lessons for  
practicing doctors and health policy-makers. The casual disposal of life was  
happening 1939 - 1945. Does Irish society of today value human life from  
conception to natural death? Has our society been affected by what St. Pope  
John Paul II described as the 'culture of death'?

On June 14th 2022 Pope Francis spoke to the Italian Jesuit publication La Civiltà  
Cattolica, to spark discussion. Pope Francis spoke about a possible World War III.  
With the complex background to the war in Ukraine and the interests involved,  
including those of arms manufacturers. He said, “we do not see the whole drama  
behind the war, which was perhaps somehow either provoked or not prevented.”
