Gospel Reflection: Today's Gospel *Matthew 16:13-20*, when Jesus asks his disciples what people are saying about who he is, they give him several answers. Then he looks at Peter and asks, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answers: "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God," a response that pleases Jesus.

"But what about you?" he [Jesus] asked. 'Who do you say I am?'"

Jesus wants us to recognise him as our God. He needs to have the first place in our lives, by living the Gospel message.

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." Matthew 22:37

Vocations : If you think you may have a vocation to the priesthood you should definitely follow it up.

Pope John Paul II urged young people who experience the call to priesthood to respond "with the boundless generosity of youth". He challenged young people to take their place in the Church:
