Gospel Reflection Matthew 18:21-35: In today's Gospel, we continue the moral teaching of how to follow the ideals of Jesus Christ if we wish to be true followers. One of the greatest signs of genuine Christianity is the ability to forgive. Today's First Reading tells us "resentment and anger, these are foul things." By contrast, the responding psalm reminds us "The Lord is compassion and love, slow to anger and rich in mercy."

Today's parable is about a man who enjoyed the cancellation of a huge debt from his master, but he failed to pass on forgiveness to somebody who owed him a little sum. When somebody has suffered a big injustice or hurt, forgiveness is very difficult. In fact, human nature on its own cannot find full forgiveness. But with the help of the Holy Spirit, a new way of looking at the injustice emerges. www.capuchinfranciscans.ie

A special screening of a documentary film called '**The Letter**' will be shown in Our Lady's Hall on Wednesday 4th October at 7:30pm.

'**The Letter**' which the film addresses is that of the Encyclical Letter of **Pope Francis 'Laudato Si'**. The film was released in 2015, addressing the plight of our common home (earth) in the light of current climate change trends, due to non-sustainable practices. The Holy Father is due to publish a follow up Apostolic Exhortation of the Encyclical this coming 4th Oct, 2023, on the feast of St Francis of Assisi.

The theme of this year's Season of Creation is '**Let Justice and Peace Flow**' (very much in line with the film) which addresses climate justice as well as the adverse effects of non-sustainable practices on the livelihoods of people.
