Resources to support the friars: Thank you for continuing to support the friars through your offerings. A Mass Offering supports a priest for one day. The friars may only receive sufficient Mass stipends for one year; this calculates at 320 Masses (approx.) per friar per year. A friar is permitted two Masses per month for his own intentions. Anything over the total amount of Masses is sent to other friaries to support those friars. This applies to all Religious Orders and is not unique to the Conventual Franciscans. The friars are obliged to offer a Pro Populo Mass every Sunday [for the people of the parish]. Over the last few years, the 12.00 Mass on Sunday was a shared Mass. The Order is permitted one shared Mass each week, therefore, the FMA takes precedence. When there were five or six intentions for the 12.00 Mass, the friars were permitted to keep the first stipend; the remaining offerings were sent away (with the Mass being satisfied). The method for Mass stipends introduced recently enables the friars to ensure there are sufficient Mass stipends to support the community for one year. Other sources of income are called Stole Fees and a percentage of stole fees for Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals are retained by the friars. However, very few offerings are made for Baptisms; one wedding scheduled for 2023. Many families choose to bypass the parish for funerals and go straight to the crematorium / cemetery. Please note that the stipends for a Mass and a wedding have remained unchanged since 2001. While the method for Mass requests may be new to you, it is the only way the friars are guaranteed a regular stipend to pay the bills.

**Leak in the Church roof:** This leak has been caused by an old roof slate - slightly moved. The roof will be repaired over the coming weeks. A number of engineers have assessed the work involved and equipment needed to repair.
