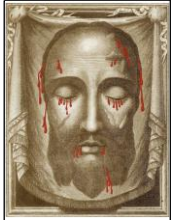

Devotion to the Holy Face was revealed by Jesus to St. Marie of St. Peter (1816-1848) a Carmelite nun of Tours in France. **The primary purpose of the devotion is to make reparation for sins against the first three commandments: Denial of God (atheism / communism), Blasphemy, and the profanation of Sundays and Holy Days.** **A Heaven – revealed Remedy to the ills of our Times.**
