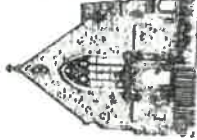

Church Donations

Thank You for all your Donations to the Church Collections online, electronic payment and by cash. It is so much appreciated. We rely completely on donations & fundraising to maintain our Church.

Donations and Collections at Mass : The bags will be passed around by collectors to each seat and then they will be taken into the Sacristy. Each parish will submit the Church (1st) and Share (2nd) collections to the Dublin Diocese.

→ **Secure donation boxes can be used at anytime. Located at each door area. Banking Card Machines can be used at any time.**

You can make your CHURCH (**FIRST COLLECTION**) and SHARE (**SECOND COLLECTION**) donations, FAMILY ENVELOPES more tax-efficient, by using envelopes. If you have not set this up already. You can contact the Parish Office by email visitation.fairview@gmail.com to find out how to easily set this up.

How does this work? Under current tax law, since we have charitable status, any cumulative donation in a given tax year to Visitation Fairview Parish of €250 or more (*by way of Family Offering, Dues, First Collection or Share Collection*) is eligible for tax relief (*amounting to almost 45% of the donation*). This tax relief would be paid directly to Visitation Fairview Parish. As can be appreciated, we can only reclaim tax for Collections when we are able to record the source of these donations. The envelope system facilitates this or write your name and address on envelope. You then simply place your donation in a FAMILY envelope.

Donations at the Shines by cash / bank card / envelope ("*shine*" written on envelope *all stay with the Parish.*)

Altar List of the Dead

The month of November gives us the opportunity to remember our dear departed when we enter their names on the Altar List of the Dead, so that they may be prayed for at all Masses during November and on the first Friday of each month for the coming year.

On 2nd November the Masses for the intentions for the month of November will begin : **N.D.L.** (*November List of the dead*)

If you wish to have the names of your loved ones inscribed on the list, there are envelopes at the back and inside of the Church. These can be returned to the Parish Office / Secure Safe / Collection Bags at any time from now until the month of December.

NEW LIFE IN CHRIST

However, many people find it difficult to understand what is meant by this word *“salvation”*. This Lectio series, answers many misunderstandings that Christians - both Catholics and non-Catholics have about the doctrine of salvation.

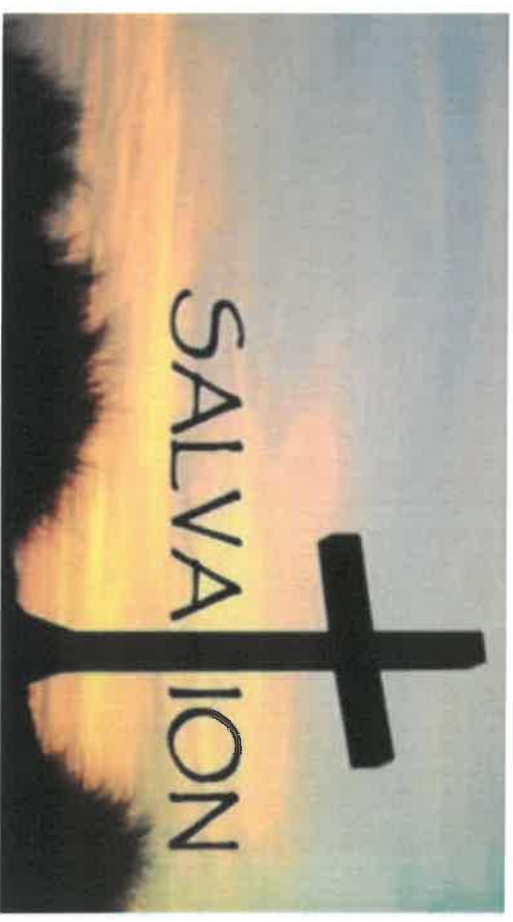
